An interesting article from Northpine (Apr. 3) via Shawn Axelrod:

AM EXPANDED BAND: FREE LICENSES? A case out of Indiana highlights the unsolved problem of AM stations that were supposed to leave the air but never did. Before consolidation in the 1990's, the FCC was trying to decide how to use the newly expanded portion of the AM band (1620-1700 KHz) and decided to allow existing stations to move to the new band in an effort to ease congestion. However, due to concern that listeners who had old radios would be left out, the FCC issued new licenses to the "moving" stations with the idea that they could keep the old frequencies on the air for up to five years. However, it was soon determined that the old and new frequencies didn't have to simulcast, and, even after some stations turned in their old licenses as planned, the five-year limit was forgotten amid deregulation that allowed groups to own multiple stations anyway. In essence, many groups got an extra AM license without having to go through the usual process associated with signing on a new station.

Now comes the case of WHLY/1580 (South Bend, IN) and its expanded band counterpart, WDND/1620. The stations ended up with separate ownership when the FCC approved a deal to sell both to the same buyer, but the buyer only closed the deal on one of the stations. Each station recently filed for ownership changes to separate companies, which the FCC has now denied, saying both would have to be sold to the same buyer. The FCC points out it also issued denials in a similar case in Michigan.

Not addressed in the FCC letters is what will ultimately be done about the stations that never left the air as originally planned. Some in the industry once thought the FCC's rationale for letting the old frequencies remain was to allow them to serve minority audiences. However, some of the stations have since adopted mainstream formats like Sports or Oldies.

Stations that were originally slated to go off the air but remain on include WLMV/1480 (Madison), KCFI/1250 (Cedar Falls-Waterloo), and KZOT/1180 (Bellevue-Omaha). The FCC recently granted license renewals for WLMV and KCFI even though their expanded band counterparts have been on the air for twelve years. KZOT is currently up for license renewal; its license was last renewed in 2005, four years after its expanded band counterpart signed on. Stations in Des Moines

(1390), Iowa City (1560), West Fargo (1550), and Sussex-Milwaukee (1370) left the air as originally planned.

And, as always, Wayne Heinen sends along the latest *NRC AM Log* updates. Wayne notes that a few of the stations listed as returning to the air may have been on for a while, but were still listed as silent in the 33rd Edition of the *Log*.

- WMBN MI **Petoskey** – 3/29 2043 – Poor with ads during break in Michigan v. Kansas NCAA basketball game, local ad or station promo mentioning “...in Cadillac...motorcycle swap meet, 93.7...” WKAD-93.7 is //WMBN-1340. **(JJR-MI)**
- KVBR MN **Brainerd** – 3/23 0006 – Poor in graveyard mess with “on Brainerd’s....Radio, 1340 KVBR” ID, local weather. **(JJR-MI)**
- KROC MN **Rochester** – 3/20 0713 – Poor in mess, “KROC-AM” ID noted in passing. **(JJR-MI)**
- WMSA NY **Massena** – 3/19 2035 – Oldies, clear “AM 1340 WMSA” ID, more oldies, another ID for WMSA and signal faded during ad string. **(TF-NH)**

- 1360 WNJC NJ **Washington Township** – 3/26 2001 – Over nothing in particular (mix of ESPN sports talkers and oldies) with PSA for Peace Corps, “...live on WNJC 1360 AM” station promo. **(MKB-ON)**

- 1430 KEZW CO **Aurora** – 3/21 0747 – Fair, out of song into ad mentioning “Colorado’s largest....health fair,” “Studio 1430” slogan said quickly into NOS tune. **(JJR-MI)**
- WBEV WI **Beaver Dam** – 3/18 0454 – Very poor with “1430 WBEV” ID under others who never ID’ed. **(JJR-MI)**

DX Tests Heard (and Not)

1230 KSEY TX Seymour – 3/24 0010 – DX not heard here. Band conditions were terrible with a high noise level (SA-MB) 3/24 0117 – Sweep tones upward over and over, from the direction of KSEY Seymour. Easily audible without much QRM by tuning the DX-398 to 1232-USB, but I am not hearing any code IDs. Also sweeps at 0119, 0123, 0125 beeps but not code?; 0128 busy signal; 0129 sweeps; 0130 rapid beeps, sweeps. 0142 now I copy: KSEY SEYMOUR TEXAS, more sweeps. I never heard any music or voice announcements from KSEY but some may have been lost in the mass of graveyard QRM. The pitch and modulation level of the code IDs were much below the sweep tones, unfortunately. It's only 209 miles from Seymour to Enid, and there are no 1230s in between. Of course we are much closer to opposite WBBZ Ponca City OK which in the daytime is a semi-local. (GH-OK) 3/24 0110-0120 – With sweep tones, Morse Code IDs, and off hook phone tones. Good and penetrating the rest. New station here at 517 miles. (WH-CO) 3-24 0009 – Poor; possible sweeps :02, two minutes worth at :09 over & over. No code, just clear sweeps. 1230 #37 TX #82, NEW! (JJR-WI) 3/24 0110 – Wasn't giving this one much of a chance to get here, so you can imagine my surprise when sweep tones and Morse Code IDs showed up at this time – and not only did they show up, they dominated everything else on 1230! Heard again from 0117-0121 with sweep tones, "phone-off-the-hook" tones and more code IDs. An e-mail was sent within minutes to Paul Walker, who confirmed it before the first hour was up. Probably the best DX test I've heard on a graveyard channel since KORN-1490 in late 1990. (RD-NE)



1400 WKBI PA St Mary's – 3/31 0100 – DX test not heard here. (SA-MB)

1480 KBXD TX Dallas – 3/17 0030 – Could hear almost nothing except the loud, almost continuous MEXICAN music station, identifying as "Nacional," who I presume to be KRXR, Gooding, ID operating on their DAYTIME POWER of 5000 watts and not their 93 watt nighttime, as has been reported before! Listened from 0030-0130; could hear a trace of English way underneath ... even tried various locations in the car, spinning it 360o to no avail. (RS-ID) 3/17 0100 – DX test not heard, only WGVU with oldies and WLMV in Spanish (SA-MB) 3/17 0101 – All I can hear for a moment in the heavy QRM is Brother Stair, who has been on KBXD for quite some time. Recheck 0130-0132, again

nothing like a DX test, and at 0132 the hoarse voice of BS audible. At 0159 a bit of BS dominant for a moment, then gone. **(GH-OK)**

1490 WVGB MS Vicksburg – 3/18 – DX test not heard. No station ID'ed. **(SA-MB)**

DX Loggings

- 550 KCRS TX Midland – 3/26 2217 – Home improvement ads, call ID and announcement of “Restaurant Tuesday.” **(JR-OK)**
- 600 KGEZ MT Kalispell – 3/25 0826 – Area news, ad for local car dealer, then more news, call letter ID. Fair signal but way under nearby KCOL. **(JW-CO)**
- 620 KTAR AZ Phoenix – 3/25 0838 – Sports, call letter ID, then a string of local ads. Fair with local noise mostly nulled. **(JW-CO)**
- 690 KRGS CO Rifle – 4/2 0829 – “You’re listening to ESPN Sports Radio on KRGS AM 690” and into ESPN Sports Center at 0830; soon faded. This in-stater is not all that common here. **(JW-CO)**
- 690 KGGF KS Coffeyville – 3/25 0147 – Open carrier/dead air presumed again, with KTSM El Paso audible underneath. **(GH-OK)**
- 750 CKJH SK Melfort – 3/14 0825 – Ad for Melfort Mustangs Internet auction; then a program note for Mustangs vs. Flin Flon hockey that night; 0827 ID as “CK 750” and into music. Fair signal. **(JW-CO)**
- 770 KAAM TX Garland – 3/22 0143 – No Mexican, just “Classic K-double A-M, where every song is a song you know,” then a song I don’t know. Whose fault is that? Is 10/1 kW U4 Garland (The Metroplex) TX, per NRC AM Log with slogan “Legends 77” which apparently no longer applies. **(GH-OK)**
- 780 KCEG CO Pueblo – 3/22 0145 – ID, Pueblo CO, ad for a CD(?) “Over There” for \$12 to a Colorado address, bluegrass music. Now the SAH with KSPI OK daytimer open carrier in the opposite direction is slower than WBBM is with KSPI. May we assume that since WBBM employs awful IBOC, it’s the one precisely on-frequency? **(GH-OK)**
- 790 KURM AR Rogers – 3/26 0858 – Obscure lo-key concert band music, some sour notes, loops E/W, unusual morning fare. I bet it’s KURM in Rogers AR. Yes, at 0900 ID for “super-radio coverage” on KURM and several FM stations too quick to copy. Was the Bentonville Concert Band, ad string of band sponsors, 1302 music resumes, but no ID of what it is and was. In the concert-band subculture there is lots of obscure modern music by XX or XXI-century composers/band directors. **(GH-OK)**
- 790 KXXX KS Colby – 3/15 0925 – “K-triple-X” with series of ads for farm & ranch real estate auctions in CO and KS, specifying date and time zone for each; in null of KURM Rogers AR doing tradio, but KXXX is stronger at the moment. In NW corner of KS, used to be listenable on groundwave here until KQCV 800 OKC upped power and splatter. **(GH-OK)**
- 830 WUMY TN Memphis – 3/22 2234 – Very good in WCCO null with “Y-105.5” ID between C&W songs “Amie” by the Pure Prairie League and “I Love A Rainy Night” by Eddie Rabbit. Confirmed via webstream. **(RD-NE)** 3/24 0202 – ID; “greatest country music ever made”; not much WCCO to compete. It’s WUMY, which must be nulled to hear a bit o’ ‘CCO. 3/26 0105 – Willie Nelson singing “All of Me,” dominant with WCCO nulled, otherwise making SAH of about 8 Hz with it, i.e. WUMY Memphis TN as first heard two nights ago, also by many others, presumably running new 8 kW non-directional day power, which FCC still shows as a CP to replace licensed 3 kW daytime only, and also with a CP for TWO WATTS at night. That’s just not enough to bother with! But doesn’t WCCO care? Some ‘clear’ channel. I can only hear it by nulling WUMY, fortunately close to 90 degrees apart from here, and then there is a slower 132/minute SAH from something else 2.2 Hz away from ‘CCO, XEIK? **(GH-OK)**
- 890 KGGN MO Gladstone – 3/26 0854 – With KTLR OKC nulled, immediate ID for KGGN plugging its Facebook and streaming, “News in a Minute” from “American Urban Radio Network.” Whence? Gladstone MO, per NRC AM Log, 960-watt daytimer. Where’s Gladstone? A suburb to the north of Kansas City. This close to a border, one must research which state the antenna really inhabit. If at the center of the FCC topo map with no pin, it’s indeed in Missouri between Gladstone and Liberty. I previously logged this on Nov 26, 2010 at 1312 UT. **(GH-OK)**

(JR-OK) 3/20 2204 – Good under KMA, on obvious day power/pattern with ID by female as “The Awesome AM,” then into Tyrone Davis’ 1970 R&B classic “Turn Back the Hands of Time.” This was followed by several delta blues numbers (heavy on the blues harp, or harmonica) with CLs finally heard at 2220. Confirmed via webstream. 2nd new logging from Ole Miss this season, and #8 overall in the South Omaha logbook. (RD-NE)
- 960 KGWA OK **Enid** – 3/25 2151 – Andrea (?) talk show with survivalist ads for Burke water filters. Call ID, weather then into news. Weak here. (JR-OK)
- 970 WGTK KY **Louisville** – 3/5 2145 – Fading & weak in clutter with talk and call ID. (JR-OK)
- 980 KMIN NM **Grants** – 3/16 0850 – Out of C&W with “You’re in K-Mine Country KMIN 9-80,” followed by Grants ads. Fair with local noise partly nulled. (JW-CO)
- 990 CBW MB **Winnipeg** – 3/27 0136 – I am observing the collision between CBW Winnipeg and XET Monterrey (which is not supposed to happen with XET beaming exclusively southward at night). They take turns dominating, and in between there is a huge SAH of about 6 Hz. Initially, XET is so strong it is even splatter-QRMing 1000 KTOK OKC unless side-tuned upward. At 0209, CBW is atop with ‘The World’ also afternoons on public radio in the USA, about fracking causing earthquakes in Oklahoma! Next story about bee die-out loses to XET, announcer saying this is his show number 18,280 since 1963y. His Spanish speech is rather slurred; must be a bit tired by now or maybe it’s just the late hour. Assuming that’s 50 years’ worth, the number works out just right for 365 shows a year! (GH-OK)
- 1050 KSIS MO **Sedalia** – 3/22 0850 – “Sedalia’s number one news-talk, AM 10-50, KSIS.” Lucky Sedalia MO, small city with more than one? Not so lucky: although it does have a lot of local or unknown talk, KSIS also propagates six hours a day of far-right Limbaugh & Hannity. By now KSIS is on 1 kW non-directional day power. (GH-OK)
- 1220 KDDR ND **Oakes** – 4/3 0854 – Ad for an auction at Valley City; weather at 0855, then C&W at 0856; covered at 0859 by local KLDC sign-on. (JW-CO)
- 1240 KWAK AR **Stuttgart** – 3/17 2247 – Fair with the Righteous Brothers’ 1974 hit “Rock and Roll Heaven,” then “KWAK” heard in ID. Tipped off to this from O’Neill, Nebraska DXer Dean Wayman in the #MWDX room on starchat.net. (RD-NE)
- 1260 KBLV ID **Idaho Falls** – 3/16 0958 – Ad for American Heritage Charter School; legal ID by man at 1000:02: “We’re East Idaho’s Talk Station – News Talk 690 KBLI Blackfoot-Pocatello and News Talk 1260 KBLV Idaho Falls”; ABC news followed. Fair signal, topping others. (JW-CO)
- 1260 KTRP ID **Weiser** – 4/3 0815 – “Classic Country for the Snake Valley...KTRP” and into music; one or two local ads at 0825, then more C&W songs, call letter ID’s. A needed call change here, ex-KWEI. Made possible by the absence of local TIS pest – hope they’re gone for good. (JW-CO)
- 1260 KTRC NM **Santa Fe** – 3/17 0957 – Ad or PSA about illegal downloading of music; ID as “Santa Fe’s Progressive Talk 1260 KTRC”; 0859 Save the Grizzly Bears PSA, legal ID, then NBC news. Good signal. (JW-CO)
- 1260 KWYR SD **Winner** – 3/16 0933 – Farm implement spot; non-ID at 0934: “2013 is the year for local AM radio and Real Country for you in Chamberlain, Gregory, and Mission. We are Country 1260” and into music; another slogan noted was “Country 1260, Real Country for South Dakota and Nebraska.” Generally fair in the mix. (JW-CO)
- 1260 KPOW WY **Powell** – 3/16 0906 – Weather forecast “for Powell and the Bighorn Basin.” Fair overall. (JW-CO)
- 1280 KZNS UT **Salt Lake City** – 3/2 2117 – Good with Utah State Univ. BKB, mention of the “Utah State Aggie Sports Network” before going into commercial break during timeout. First time I’ve heard this from any QTH, and it’s Utah logging #8 from here. (RD-NE)
- 1320 KRDD NM **Roswell** – 3/19 0824 – Noted with ID and slogan sounding like “La Que Mande,” followed by Latino music. Poor in QRM. (JW-CO)
- 1340 KKAM TX **Lubbock** – 3/28 0817 – Atop the graveyard, “Sportsradio 13-40, the band(?)” Not sure of last word, plugs website, Facebook, twitter. Loops ENE/WSW so not my groundwaver KGHM OKC. 1219 mentions Texas Tech. Aha, it’s really “The Fan” as in KKAM Lubbock TX, vide <http://1340thefan.com/> Distance between cities, if not transmitter/receiver sites, but close: 298 miles. I don’t suppose that is a GY record. (GH-OK)

- 1390 KFFK AK Rogers – 3/18 1805 – Talk show; ID; News ad for AMS Credit.com. Ad for All Things Outdoor @ 479-236-3956. Ad for Happy Day Auto Repair at 1746 South Shore in Fayetteville. Alex Jones talk show. GPN Radio Net. **(SS-KS)**
- 1440 WGEM IL Quincy – 3/7 2215 – Call ID, news and weather. **(JR-OK)**
- 1500 KJIM TX Sherman – 3/17 1920 – ID as “AM 1500 KJIM, Your Memory Maker.” Nostalgia music. Very strong = No KSTP. **(SS-KS)**
- 1540 KEDA TX San Antonio – 3/20 2150 – SS Music and talk with EE call ID. **(JR-OK)**
- 1540 KEDA TX San Antonio – 3/24 2150 – SS music, IDing as “R. Jalapeño.” **(JR-OK)**
- 1550 KAPE MO Cape Girardeau – 3/7 2130 – Michael Savage talk with call ID and “Cape Radio 15-50.” **(JR-OK)**
- 1550 KESJ MO St. Joseph – 3/21 0759 – Home Depot spot; legal ID at 0759:52: “St. Joseph’s local sports authority – AM 1550 KESJ...” Poor, fighting it out with others. **(JW-CO)**
- 1580 CKDO ON Oshawa – 3/6 2125 – Good signal on fade ups with announcement of show at the GM Center and call ID. **(JR-OK)**

- 1690 WVON IL Berwyn – 2/20 2208 – UC talk and call ID. **(JR-OK)**
- 1700 KKLF TX Richardson – 3/5 1430 – Continuous comedy routines. **(JR-OK)**

- 950 UNID -- 3/24 0822 – With adjacent local KGWA 960 nulled, Spanish vs. English preachers making slow SAH. The English is presumably KJRG Newton KS, and first guess for the Spanish is XEFA Chihuahua city, though I would be more pleased if it were KDCE Española NM. **(GH-OK)**
- 1020 UNID -- 3/10 0155 – What luck, my semi-local KOKP Perry OK is not only not modulating but no carrier! It’s totally off, so what can I hear with KDKA nulled? Tropical music in Spanish. At first I suspect Cuba, but DFing this, it’s more like N/S. There are six Mexicans on 1020, and four of them in the eastern part, any of which would be welcome. Of course fade down for ID at 0600, but it’s by a SHVA (super-hype voice actor) which certainly rules out Cuba so it has to be Mexican. Or Unitedstatesian. Oh, I bet it’s just KMMQ in Nebraska, which I normally hear when on 50 kW day power around sunrise, but which does run 1400 watts at night, and the direction fits. Furthermore, it did not play the Mexican NA at midnight CST. **(GH-OK)**
- 1060 UNID -- 3/28 0201 – Mexican music, no fast SAH so I am hoping it’s something other than 10 kW daytime gospel cheater KIJN Farwell TX on the NM border, which is off-frequency and usually heard with the fast SAH if there is any competition. Then the fast SAH comes and goes. Maybe KIJN is just peaking so strong as to overcome any SAH-producer. **(GH-OK)**
- 1320 UNID -- 3/15 0907 – Spanish time check for 8:08, temperatura tope 12 grados, I thought they said, meaning predicted hi, somewhere in the CDT zone. I thought I had KRDD Roswell NM as DF seemed ENE/WSW, but that’s in MDT. Heavy CCI; then I am still getting it with a SSE/NNW peak, so points to KXYZ Houston, which is CDT, but today’s hi per NWS there will be 78 degrees F = 25 C.

Maybe it was really the current temp. Wish we had a schedule of what times KXYZ is SS rather than Chinese or others. (GH-OK)

- 1410 UNID -- 3/28 0202 – Gospel in good Spanish but with perceptible gringo accent atop the QRM for a moment, and seems NE/SW. IRCA Mexican Log has no 1410 station with a specifically religious format; the NRC AM Log for the USA points to KHCH Huntsville TX, Radio Amistad, but it was silent as of last April, and that's at a right angle from the Houston market. Current status? (GH-OK)
- 1420 UNID -- 3/26 0914 – Sounds like Don Imus, looping NW/SE but fading out half a sesquihour after sunrise here. Can't find any 1420 affiliate on Imus website in adjacent or second-adjacent states. KULY Ulysses KS is supposedly country, and KJCK Junction City KS program schedule confirms no Imus there. (GH-OK)
- 1520 UNID -- 3/28 0814 – KOKC with heavy SAH of 32/minute = 0.53 Hz, but absolutely no other audio than KOKC with 'America's Morning News.' Some station not modulating, warming up for sign-on? Still there by 0830 during KOKC local news headlines. I also suspected KOKC self-QRM by running backup transmitter, but the SAH seemed to peak in its null. (GH-OK)
- 1670 UNID -- 3/28 2210 – Very weak TIS with continuous weather under sports talk. (JR-OK)

IRCA Log conflicts, showing XEHW as *Ovni Radio*, Rosario, 5/1 kW, parallel 90.1 FM. 2013 WRTH splits the difference, as *La Kañona* in Rosario! So which is it? At 1546 after ad and PSA string, another ID as “La Mejor, 102.7 y 600,” back to ‘Línea Directa’, 8:46 timecheck. Apparently *La Mejor* is a nationwide brand, but I am hearing local origination. [Hauser-OK]

- 620 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, Colón MAR 22 0200 – 9-note Rebelde sounder; in jumble with domestics. [Connelly-MA]
- 620 **MEXICO** XEBU *La Norteñita*, Chihuahua, Chih. MAR 17 0552 – Official PSAs for Cámara de Senadores and then Cámara de Diputados about what great work the pols are doing in vague generalities, then “La Norteñita, Chihuahua” jingle. [Hauser-OK]
- 630 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, multiple sites MAR 20 0559 – Over/under WPRO; contact info, “Radio Progreso, Infanta 105, La Habana Cuba, coreo postal 10300,” and web address, “rprogreso.icrt.cu,” parallel 640 and 690 kHz. [Conti-NH] MAR 22 0100 – Parallel 640 with pop-soul female vocal; mixed with WUNO and WPRO. [Connelly-MA]
- 640 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, two sites MAR 22 0100 – Parallel 630 with female vocal; good. [Connelly-MA]
- 640 **GADELOUPE** *R.Guadeloupe*, Pointe-à-Pitre MAR 22 0200 – French news by man; over presumed Cuba. [Connelly-MA]
- 650 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Ciego de Avila MAR 22 0200 – Vocal parallel 660; mixed with *R.Rebelde*. [Connelly-MA]
- 650 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, Santiago de Cuba MAR 22 0200 – 9-note Rebelde sounder; punching through co-channel *R.Progreso*. [Connelly-MA]
- 660 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Jovellanos MAR 22 0200 – Vocal parallel 650; under WFAN. [Connelly-MA]
- 660 **MEXICO** XEFZ Monterrey, NL MAR 17 0554 – Spanish pastor closing with address in NL, full legal ID for ABC Radio, 660, XEFZ, 10,000 watts, street address in Monterrey, 0555 choral national anthem. Monterrey is far enough from the border not to be influenced by early start of DST in El Norte. MAR 31 0553 – Choral Mexican national anthem playing early before someone's CST midnight; 0556 amid other Mex interference, ID mentions Monterrey, i.e. XEFZ, 250 watts at night per IRCA. [Hauser-OK]
- 660 **MEXICO** XEACB *La Lupe*, Cd. Delicias, Chih. APR 1 0548 – Mexican music is dominant, certainly no WFAN, then singing ID for FM “98.9” which Cantú matches with the station heard several times before: XEACB. [Hauser-OK]
- 660 **MEXICO** XEAR *La Mexicana*, Tampico, Tamps. APR 1 1032 – Mexi-tune, male canned, “la Mexicana... lugar... XEAR, la Mexicana” and into ballad, followed by another canned ID mentioning FM and AM. [Krueger-FL]
- 670 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, multiple sites MAR 22 0200 – 9-note Rebelde sounder on two audios with about a 1 to 2 second delay, news by woman with “splash” sounds between items; loud. [Connelly-MA] APR 3 2330 – Parallel 600 with Rebelde talk by man; over presumed YVLL. [Connelly*O-MA]
- 690 **COLOMBIA** HJCZ *W Radio*, Bogotá APR 4 0000 – Parallel 700 HJCX with soft music “W Radio, la... de Colombia” network ID; mixed with CKGM. [Connelly*O-MA]



- 690 unID MAR 31 0548 – Spanish report about Pemex, peaks south/southwest, so most likely XEN in DF with news/talk format. Slow SAH with open carrier, no doubt KGGF again. [Hauser-OK]
- 700 COLOMBIA HJCX *W Radio*, Cali APR 4 0000 – Parallel 690 HJCZ with soft music “W Radio, la... de Colombia” network ID; dominant over jumble. [Connelly*O-MA]
- 700 MEXICO XEDKR *R.Red*, Guadalajara, Jal. MAR 28 1202 – Mentions “red de Radio Red,” i.e. per Cantú XEDKR. [Hauser-OK]
- 710 CUBA *R.Rebelde*, multiple sites MAR 22 0200 – Rebelde 9-note sounder with echo, woman with news in Spanish; under WOR. [Connelly-MA]
- 720 COLOMBIA HJAN *Emisoras Unidas*, Barranquilla APR 4 0000 – Tropical music, ID “Emisoras Unidas... fabulosa”; over others. LSB used to dodge WOR IBOC. [Connelly*O-MA]
- 720 MEXICO XEDE Saltillo, Coah. MAR 26 0555 – Usual slow SAH with WGN, and with that nulled, ID for 105.7 and XEDE Saltillo, 11:54 time check, choral national anthem which lasts only 2 minutes until 0557 another automated time check as 11:56, ID again. Male SHVA alternates with less hyped female announcer. MAR 27 1205 – “La Kaliente 105.7 y 720” by SHVA, then 6:04 time check by live DJ. [Hauser-OK]
- 730 MEXICO XEX México, DF MAR 19 0500 – Under *R.Progreso* and CKAC; “TDW” Morse code. 0600 under CKAC; choral national anthem, then several repetitions of “TDW” Morse code. [Conti-NH]
- 730 MEXICO unID MAR 19 0547 – XE choral national anthem playing at odd time on weak signal under Spanish talker, latter presumed XEX. That narrows it down to one of the octet of other Mexican 730s. [Hauser-OK]
- 750 MEXICO XETI *La Huasteca*, Tempoal, Ver. MAR 23 0550 – With WSB nulled, música tropical segués, no announcements; I must have dozed thru hourtop, missing an ID, as at 0602 Mexican national anthem is playing, 0603 dead air, 0603.6 replaced by noise for a while: Note to station: turn the main transmitter off *first*, then the STL. MAR 24 0548 – I am trying again to ID the tropical music station: not much WSB now, must be semi-auroral conditions. Yes, at 0550, “La Huasteca, cien por ciento huasteca.” MAR 28 1201 – XE national anthem, 1202 unfamiliar state anthem, 1204 full ID for La Huasteca, XHTI y XETI, sub-slogan “la gigante.” [Hauser-OK]
- 760 COLOMBIA HJAJ RCN Barranquilla APR 3 2331 – RCN ID; over Brazil. [Connelly*O-MA]
- 770 CUBA *R.Rebelde*, Victoria de las Tunas MAR 22 0200 – 9-note sounder, Rebelde news with “splash” sounds; under WABC. [Connelly-MA]
- 770 MEXICO XEREV Los Mochis, Sin. MAR 21 0608 – “Los 40 Principales” 104.3 FM ID, rock in English, dominating channel. Hard to believe it’s the 100-watts-at-night XEREV as in IRCA Log, but it’s the only XE on 770 with that slogan and that corresponding FM. Cantú agrees the power is 5000 watts day, 100 watts night. WRTH says the day power is only 1000 watts, but all three agree on the night power. My first definite log of this one. MAR 24 1228 – “En Sinaloa nací” tribute song, mentions Mazatlán, Culiacán, but later also adjacent states Sonora, Durango, Chihuahua; a daily ritual? 1232 ID for “Chávez Radio K,” *Los 40 Principales* XHREV, 5:32 timecheck, i.e. FM side of XEREV. Today’s Los Mochis sunrise was not until 1314 UTC. [Hauser-OK]
- 780 MEXICO XEWGR *Exa FM*, Monclova, Coah. MAR 28 1205 – With KSPI Stillwater OK nulled (deeply thanks to groundwave), woman plugging website, can’t copy it, but no problem since then she says “Buenos días, Coahuila,” temp in Monclova, so it is XEWGR. [Hauser-OK]
- 790 CUBA *R.Reloj*, two sites MAR 20 0600 – Good and dominant; “Dos de la madrugada,” and “En año 55 de la revolución, transmite Radio Reloj desde Habana Cuba.” [Conti-NH] MAR 22 0200 – Reloj beeps, news; in jumble with WPRV, WAXY, WNIS. [Connelly-MA]
- 790 MEXICO XENT La Paz, BCS MAR 24 1226 – Long string of 8-digit phone numbers repeated, “escuchan Grupo Fórmula,” gobierno federal PSA, “Fórmula, 970 AM” ID, i.e. flagship XERFR México DF whose local IDs are relayed all over the country. There are two affiliates on 790, XEGAJ Guadalajara, Jal., and XENT La Paz, BCS, surely the latter as loops southwest. Today’s sunrise in Guadalajara is 1254, and La Paz 1321 per gaisma.com, and 1229 here. Usual conflicting info about powers; IRCA says XEGAJ is 1 kW, Cantú and WRTH say 250 watts. IRCA and WRTH say XENT is 5/0.75 kW, Cantú says 10/0.75 kW. [Hauser-OK]
- 800 MEXICO unID MAR 25 0505 – Surprised to hear the Mexican national anthem on a fixed radio, so hoping for anything but XEROK, quickly grab the DX-398 to get a DF on it, but too late, only hearing XEROK, which would normally be antheming at local midnite MDT =

0600 UT; however, maybe Sunday nites only plays it right after 'La Hora Nacional' which originates live from DF at 0400-0500 UTC until the rest of Mexico goes on DST April 7. [Hauser-OK]

- 820 **ST. KITTS & NEVIS** TBN *R.Paradise*, Charlestown MAR 20 0300 – Southern U.S. preacher; fair. [Connelly-MA] APR 3 2303 – U.S. preacher, choir; fair. [Connelly*O-MA]
- 830 **MEXICO** XEIK Piedras Negras, Coah. MAR 28 1159 – Partial singing ID for “Piedras Negras, Coahuila, la cien punto nueve FM.” So obviously XEIK, common border station here, altho Cantú does not yet show it on any FM dupe, but IRCA does, as XHIK 100.9. [Hauser-OK]
- 840 **HAITI** *Radio 4VEH*, Cap Haitien APR 3 2330 – Hymn with French female vocal and the melody of “Amazing Grace”; fair. [Connelly*O-MA]
- 860 **CUBA** *R.Reloj*, MAR 22 0200 – Reloj ticks, beeps; mixed with CJBC. [Connelly-MA]
- 870 **CUBA** *R.Reloj*, multiple sites APR 4 0002 – Morse “RR” beeps, Reloj news, ticks; loud, clobbering WLVP. [Connelly*O-MA]
- 880 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Mantua MAR 30 0900 – Strong under WCBS; canned ID with theme song, then chime marking the hour into La Primera Hora, parallel 640, 690, and 750 kHz. [Conti-NH]
- 900 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, San Germán MAR 22 0200 – Talk “desde la Habana”; in jumble. [Connelly-MA]
- 900 **MEXICO** XEDT Cd. Cuauhtémoc, Chih. MAR 21 0602 – After choral national anthem, full ID for XEDT, Ciudad Cuauhtémoc, Chihuahua, and XHDT 98.3 with 25 kW; then music starts but abruptly cuts off the air at 0603, apparently intentional midnight close for the AM side, but extremely rude. At least it's more than the sked in IRCA Mexican Log showing 14-02 UTC on 900. Did not hear the name *Hits FM* as in IRCA and WRTH, but it's obvious the AM is now treated as subsidiary. [Hauser-OK]
- 910 **CUBA** *R.Cadena Agramonte*, Camagüey MAR 19 0459 – Good; “Radio Noticias” with Camagüey and Cuba news. [Conti-NH]
- 940 **PUERTO RICO** WIPR *Máxima 940*, San Juan MAR 22 0200 – “Máxima... nueve cuarenta” ID slogan. [Connelly-MA] APR 3 2328 – Máxima ID; over second Spanish talker (likely YVNN) and U.S. religious station. [Connelly*O-MA] APR 5 0900 – Fair; nostalgia, promo, “...por Máxima 940.” [Conti-NH]
- 950 unID MAR 24 1222 – With adjacent local 960 KGWA nulled, Spanish vs English preachers making slow SAH. The English is presumably KJRG Newton KS, and first guess for the Spanish is XEFA Chihuahua city, tho I would be more pleased if it were KDCE Española NM. [Hauser-OK]
- 990 **MEXICO** XET *La T Grande*, Monterrey, NL MAR 18 0800 – Under WNTP; canned ID, “XET La T Grande de Monterrey... con 50 mil wats de potencia... cubriendo todo México, cubriendo todo México...” with a flourish of tones in the middle. Later heard the same canned ID on XET streaming audio. New log. [Conti-NH] MAR 27 1206 – “XET, La T Grande, Monterrey, 50 mil wats, cubriendo todo México,” then opening second hour of news, “Enlace 99.” All of Mexico, that is except where the ten other 990 stations can overcome it! In fact, XET dominates here now at night, not just at dawn and dusk; haven't heard CBW in quite a while, conditions? Had to consult the NRC Pattern Book again to reassure myself that XET at night is supposed to radiate a circle tangent southward only, altho non-direxional daytime. Today's Monterrey sunrise would be 1238, while in Enid it's 1224 UTC. MAR 28 0536 – I am observing the collision between CBW Winnipeg and XET Monterrey (which is not supposed to happen with XET beaming exclusively southward at night). They take turns dominating, and in between there is a huge SAH of about 6 Hz. Initially, XET is so strong it is even splattering 1000 KTOK unless side-tuned upward. [Hauser-OK] MAR 31 1056 – Mexi-tune, “XET, la T Grande de Monterrey... 50 mil vatios...” [Krueger-FL]
- 1000 **MEXICO** XEOY *R.Mil*, México DF MAR 31 1114 – Spanish ballads, ID, parallel SW 6010. [Krueger-FL]
- 1030 **MEXICO** XELJ *Ke Buena*, León, Gto. MAR 28 0603 – “La Ke Buena” slogan, romantic music; seems northeast/southwest but of the dozen 1030s in Cantú, two are allegedly daytimers and the only Ke Buena is XELJ 20,000 2,000. IRCA Mexican log agrees XELJ is the only Ke Buena on 1030, but shows it as 5/1 kW, and transmitter at Lagos de Moreno, Jalisco. 2013 WRTH also shows it must be XELJ but agrees with Cantú on the power, with IRCA on the site. Could be a U.S. station? No such slogan in NRC AM Log, but there is a WGSF *R.Abiente*, Memphis. [Hauser-OK]
- 1050 **MEXICO** XEBCS *La Paz*, BCS APR 2 1223 – Hardly any signal from XEG, but instead “La Radio de Sud-California” with FM 99.1, orchestral music turning into romantic song. IRCA



- has no FM parallel but this info: XEBCS La Paz, 10000/-1, Radio Cultural Surcaliforniana, Gobierno del Estado, 1300-0500, from Universidad Autónoma de BCS. Cantú agrees on the slogan version I copied, as 10 kW daytime only; link to this website www.bcs.gob.mx but I get “no site configured.” WRTH think it’s 10/1 kW, i.e. fulltime. DST doesn’t start in BCS until April 7, but already on an hour earlier than WRTH and IRCA think. Cantú has no FM connexion either for XEBCS, but lists a different La Paz station on 99.1: “XHBCP 99.1 FM La Radio Contigo” whose only URL is a facebook page but it doesn’t work either. Were these stations related, or XEBCS took it over? La Paz seems so exotically remote, but only if you’re driving there, which I have never accomplished. [Hauser-OK]
- 1060 **MEXICO** XEEP *R.Educación*, México, DF MAR 20 0600 – Under KYW; choral national anthem. [Conti-NH]
- 1110 **CUBA** *R.Angulo*, Holguín MAR 19 0800 – Under WBT; Angulo doorbells marking the hour. [Conti-NH]
- 1150 **CUBA** *R.Bayamo*, Bueycito MAR 20 0800 – Under WWDJ; Bayamo doorbell chimes parallel 1620 kHz. [Conti-NH]
- 1180 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, multiple sites MAR 22 0200 – Rebelde sounder, talk; mixed with WHAM. [Connelly-MA]
- 1280 **CUBA** *R.Enciclopedia*, Varadero APR 2 1054 – Poor under unidentified domestic Spanish and WTMV Sarasota, but parallel 530 and 1310 kHz. [Krueger-FL]
- 1310 **CUBA** *R.Enciclopedia*, Nueva Gerona, Isla de la Juventud APR 2 1052 – Instrumental version of John Lennon’s “Love” and parallel 530 kHz. Fair. [Krueger-FL]
- 1320 **CUBA** *R.Artemisa*, Artemisa APR 2 1044 – Male news, fanfare sound effects, ID. Parallel better 1020 kHz. [Krueger-FL]
- 1320 **CUBA** *Radio 26*, La Jaiba APR 2 1044 – Mixing about equally with *R.Artemisa*. Female with news items. Parallel better 1060 kHz. [Krueger-FL]
- 1320 **MEXICO** XECPN Piedras Negras, Coah. MAR 31 1208 – Live DJ IDs as “La Poderosa, 1320 AM” and also an FM I could not catch, with almanac items, including death/birth of Selena so 1213 plays her song “Amor Prohibido” (Forbidden Love), soon fades out, from southwest peak. Slogan fits for XECPN which is powerful only on day rig of 20 kW, night 100 watts per IRCA Log. [Hauser-OK]
- 1320 unID MAR 15 1307 – Spanish time check for 8:08, temperatura tope 12 grados, I thought they said, meaning predicted hi, somewhere in the CDT zone. I thought I had KRDD Roswell as DF seemed east-northeast/west-southwest, but that’s in MDT, so points to KXYZ Houston, which is CDT, but today’s hi per NWS there will be 78° F = 25 C. Maybe it was really the current temp. Wish we had a schedule of what times KXYZ is Spanish rather than Chinese or others. Hmm, I should be looking at Tejas-border Mexicans, which observe CDT already unlike most of México and would routinely temp in Celsius, i.e. XECPN Piedras Negras, 20 kW day power with news format per IRCA Log. [Hauser-OK]
- 1350 **CUBA** *R.Ciudad del Mar*, Aguada APR 1 0943 – Male and female announcers, mentioning Provincia de Camagüey, into traditional folk vocal. [Krueger-FL]
- 1350 unID MAR 31 0534 – “Viva México” song; DF fits for KCOR San Antonio, the usual Spanish dominator, but would they play such a song? Can you imagine any Mexican station playing USA patriotic music? [Hauser-OK]
- 1480 **MEXICO** unID MAR 17 0600 – Something in Spanish, sounds like “La Fogata Norteña,” into choral national anthem. It must have been short version as retuned at 0602 I had already missed a more specific ID. No such slogan listed anywhere for a Mexican 1480 station; search leads only to a restaurant in México DF. Fogata means bonfire. Of the 1480s listed, most likely one of Monterrey, Monclova, or Delicias. But is it really a new station slogan or another restaurant? “Definitivamente ‘La Fogata Norteña’ es un restaurante cerca del centro de la Ciudad de México y no una estación de radio,” per Julián Santiago Díez de Bonilla, DF. MAR 25 0600 – Very heavy interference, sounds like “La Voz del Tiempo,” maybe mentions Los Mochis, but there is no Sinaloa on 1480. Closest match to that slogan in Cantú is XECARH *La Voz del Pueblo Hñá-Hñú*, Ixmiquilpan, Hidalgo, 5 kW daytimer, which would certainly be an exotic catch. IRCA shows 2.5 kW day at 1200-2300, unknown at night. WRTH shows 2.5 kW fulltime and location as Cárdonal, 1300-2300 in Spanish, Otomí and Náhuatl. [Hauser-OK]
- 1520 **COLOMBIA** HJLI *Libertad*, Bogotá MAR 18 0859 – Under WWKB open carrier; “La palabra de Dios...” and “la comunidad manantial” with Bogotá and Colombia mentions. Per Henrik Klemetz at RealDX, this was a plug for meetings of the Comunidad Manantial de Vida at “Diagonal 46A No. 51-40 en Bogotá, Colombia, Centro Comercial Venecia Plaza, 2o. piso, Barrio Venecia, Comunidad Manantial.” New log. [Conti-NH]



- 1560 **CUBA** *R.Enciclopedia*, Ciego de Avila APR 2 1104 – Original version of “Wunderland bei Nacht” by Stefan Mross barely coming through while paralleling to 530 on the IC-R75. First time I have heard 1560 (1570 has been logged a few times, though not this morning). Lots of co-channel from the unidentified Mexican which was also playing instrumentals to confuse matters, plus an unidentified USA sports feed station, and WAGL. [Krueger-FL]
- 1560 **MEXICO** XEINFO México DF APR 2 1104 – Tentatively the one. And my third log of this XE format station here. Nonstop Mexican instrumentals, even what we call “The Mexican Hat Dance” at 1119. Co-channel and WAGL Lancaster, SC from sign-on at 1115 with a big signal, ID and Southern Gospel vocals, a USA sports station feed, and a very weak *R.Enciclopedia* (also with instrumentals). This same format was heard FEB 28 0038+ with a mention of “50 mil vatios” which would surely indicate it’s XEINFO. But I find no other logs that confirm this format, which seemingly is commercial-free on all of my listens. [Krueger-FL]
- 1610 **ANGUILLA** *Caribbean Beacon*, The Valley APR 3 2304 – U.S. male preacher; good. [Connelly*O-MA]
- 1620 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, La Habana and Guantánamo MAR 22 0200 – Parallel 1180 et al. with 9-note Rebelde sounder, news; dominant. [Connelly-MA] APR 3 2304 – Spanish talk by man including Rebelde ID; over WDHP. [Connelly*O-MA]
- 1620 **U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS** WDHP Frederiksted APR 3 2358 – Caribbean-accented talk show; fair over Cuba. [Connelly*O-MA]
- 2910 **MEXICO** XEVT Villahermosa, Tab. MAR 25 0535 – Very weak music, slightly on lo side, presumably 3 x 970 XEVT as per my previous extensive tracking. Mike Gilchrist in east-central Iowa has also been hearing this lately, not yet with a definite ID. As I found they are extremely rarely given. Schedule is roughly 11-06 UTC, presumably to become 10-05 with Mexican DST which does not start until April 7, a date originally coordinated with USA, until we moved it almost a month earlier, dragging border towns along with us. [Hauser-OK]

Hauser Het Hunt: Transpacific carrier search around sunrise here MAR 31 1219: At 1216, barely audible ones on 774, 738, 702, 657; at 1219 on 828, 882. I usually check 774 first and assume it’s Japan, but companion 747 is missing! Then I more carefully DF these and find they are peaking from west/east, not northwest/southeast, ergo not from Asia but from Australia/Pacific. With nothing but carriers and rough DFs, likely: 774 3LO Melbourne; 738 Tahiti; 702 2BL Sydney; 657 RNZ Wellington; but 828 & 882 nothing above 10 kW in Pacific. Just before sunrise APR 2 1216; this time at 1210 I started 9-kHz-with-DX-398-BFO steps at high end of MW band, so probably missed some which faded out sooner at the low end: 1332, 1314, 1125, 1098, 1035, 891, 882, 846, 828, and by 1216 UT, 774, but none lower. All of them seemed to peak from slightly south of due west, i.e. Pacific rather than E Asian which come from the northwest. Around sunrise here APR 4 1209-1213: detected on 594, 702, 774, 828, 1008, 1098, 1116. Can’t be positive all these are real, as 594 seemed to peak north/south, and 1098 was unlikely Marshall Islands in past years. But how will signals at 9-kHz intervals be audible on my DX-398 otherwise?



Here is Major League Baseball (MLB) flagship information for the 2013 season from my Internet searches.

http://mlb.mlb.com/mlb/audio/mlb_team_radio_flagships.jsp has flagship information, but it differs from what I found via Internet searches. Please send me announcer information (and corrections), as some of the web pages either did not list the announcer names or were definitely from last season (and maybe did not change for this season, but I have no way of knowing). And sometimes I cannot determine if an announcer is on radio only, TV only, or both. The 2013 copyright statement on each mlb.com page is probably placed there automatically, even if the page content has not changed for the 2013 season.

http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List_of_current_Major_League_Baseball_broadcasters has broadcaster information, but the references at the end of that web page list "Retrieved 2010-11-11" for many teams.

In some cases I was not sure that the network list was for the 2013 season, as many lists were undated. If I found a list that had no definite 2013 date but differed from the list I found last year, then I treated the list as one for the 2013 season.

Note that if a station streams its broadcasts over the Internet, I believe that the station cannot stream the baseball broadcasts because the Major League Baseball organization wants listeners to get a paid subscription via mlb.com.

On the mlb.com site for some teams, the announcers are listed under the "ROSTER" tab.

It is now time to begin collecting Minor League Baseball information; please send me what you can find. Thanks.


